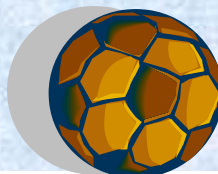
Spring 2012 Registration

Fall Registration begins the week of November 7th.

All registrations must be completed online at www.coloradostorm.com. You will login to your member account and select Recreational Registration for your area.

- If you **played Fall 2011 season**, you will need to login to your member account to register for the spring season. Select 'register now'.
- If you have **registered your player for the full year**, spring and fall, then you do not have to register again for spring.
- If you have friends that **did not play for the Fall 2011**, but would like to play for Colorado Storm, they will need to create a NEW FAMILY ACCOUNT.

The returning player deadline is January 14th. In order for your player to return to their same team, you need to register by January 16th and make a payment . We will add transferring and new players to teams soon after the January 16th deadline. New registrations will then be added on a first come basis.



Winter Touches-Coaches Corner

The winter time can be a difficult time to maintain touches on a ball for most kids. Here are a few suggestions for kids to keep a foot on the ball.

-With the weather here in Denver we need to look for our opportunities to get out and work on some juggling at least couple times per week. When juggling try to get two-three touches on your feet then catch. As you get better you can up the total of juggles.

-When the weather is bad, have your kid's sit in a chair that their feet can touch the ground. With the ball at their feet roll the ball around using all surfaces of their foot. They can do this while watching television, playing games, or anything else that requires them to sit in a chair.

-Lastly, if they have access to a wall that they can kick against, have them work on touching the ball back and forth from just a few feet away using both feet and all areas of their foot. This way they can get the feel for what it is like to use their laces and inside of their foot without hitting the ball hard. Ideally they can do this without shoes on; this way can be the best way to teach them to keep their toes down and ankle locked.

Technical Topics Covered

- Week 1** - Ball mastery, agility, foot work, & speed drills. Passing and receiving drills. Controlling the ball with different parts of the body. First touch to open space.
- Week 2** - Skill moves to beat a player (scissor, side step, inside outside, step over ect.), Hesitation Moves. Turning with the ball. Players will grow confidence on how to attack defenders.
- Week 3** - Correct techniques of defending (correct body shape), tackling (block and poke tackle), and containing. Players will improve and better develop their defensive techniques.
- Week 4** - Shooting with correct technique and power. Facing goal, back to goal, skill to beat a player and shoot, and combining to get a shot off.
- Week 5** - 1v1, 2v2 attacking and defending. Attacking and defending tactics in small number situations.

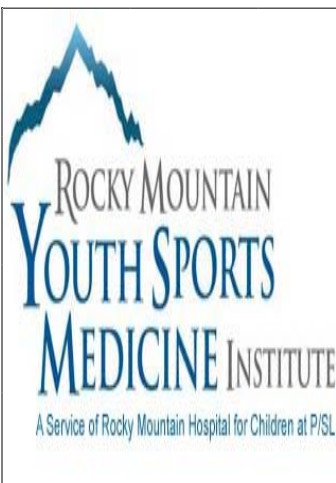
